Upcoming Events For Families

12th December - Flu vaccinations: All children, where permission has been given, will receive their flu vaccination. If you have not given consent for this, your child will not receive the vaccination.

<u>12th December – Homework projects are due in:</u> Year 1 – Year 6 children should bring their homework projects into school. These will be shared and displayed in class.

<u>13th December – Brass Showcase Assembly:</u> To broaden the musical instrument tuition on offer at **I** Kingsfield, we will be hosting a brass showcase to share what children could achieve by taking brass **I** instrument lessons. This will be followed up by a taster day (20th December) of lessons for all those **I** Key Stage 2 children who would be interested in learning to play a brass instrument.

14th December - KS1 Christmas Production 9am & 2pm: This will be held in the King Edward hall – please remember to bring your tickets. The PTA will be providing tea, coffee and mince pies for a donation. There will also be a raffle. Exit after the performance will be via the Burnsfield Estate only.

Reception and Key Stage 1 disco will take place from 3.15pm. Please send your child to school with their outfit; staff will help children to change and prepare for the disco. Parents can collect at 4.15pm from the King Edward Hall. The Key Stage 2 disco will begin at 4.30pm. Children should enter the Burnsfield Hall; collection will be at 5.30pm from the King Edward Hall.

15th December – Reception visit the Library: Children will need a warm, waterproof coat for this visit. The children will return to school prior to lunchtime.

15th December – Key Stage 1 Advent Assembly: Juliette and Claire from the Chatteris Parish Church will be leading an assembly for our Key Stage 1 children all about advent.

Reading At Home

The government has produced a 'reading framework' document for staff to access and part of it talks about engaging children in reading at home. It's so important that children share books with family members for a whole range of reasons including developing vocabulary, understanding story structure, hearing about different cultures and traditions and hearing good models of reading. However, **sharing a book is a moment to be cherished and a memory created.** This is what the document suggests that parents / carers do to read at home. We hope you find it useful!

Introduction

Your child will bring home two books. One is for your child to read to you. It has been carefully chosen so that they can work out all the words. The other book has words your child may not be able to read yet. It is for you to read to your child and talk about together.

How to read a story to your child

If you can find the time beforehand, read the read-aloud book to yourself first, so you can think about how you're going to read it to your child.

On the first reading:

- Make reading aloud feel like a treat. Make it a special quiet time and cuddle up so you can both see the book.
- Show curiosity about what you're going to read: 'This book looks interesting. It's about an angry child. I wonder how angry he gets...'
- Read through the whole story the first time without stopping too much. Let the story weave its own magic.
- Read with enjoyment. If you're not enjoying it, your child won't. Read favourite stories over and over again.

On later readings:

- Let your child pause, think about and comment on the pictures.
- If you think your child did not understand something, try to explain: 'Oh! I think what's happening here is that...'
- Chat about the story and pictures: 'I wonder why she did that?'; 'Oh no, I hope she's not going to...'; 'I wouldn't have done that, would you?'
- Link the stories to your own family experiences: 'This reminds me of when ...'
- Link stories to others that your child knows: 'Ah! Do you remember the dragon in? Do you remember what happened to him?'
- Encourage your child to join in with the bits they know.
- Avoid asking questions to test what your child remembers.
- Avoid telling children that reading stories is good for them.
