Earlier this week I had the privilege of visiting each class during their Well-being Wednesday Assemblies. Guidance on Living with COVID-19 from the NHS:

## Living with COVID-19: advice for those aged 18 and under

Has your child or young person aged 18 or under tested positive, or do they feel unwell with COVID-19 or flu-like symptoms? If so, there are a few simple steps they can take to protect their family and community – especially those at highest risk of severe illness.

 <b>If they feel unwell and have a high temperature, with COVID-19 or flu-like symptoms, they should:</b>	 <b>Try to stay at home,</b> avoid contact with others and follow the guidance on <a href="https://www.gov.uk">gov.uk</a>	 <b>Try to avoid going to school, college or childcare</b> until they no longer have a high temperature and are well enough to return	 <b>Carry on attending as normal if they only have mild symptoms</b> like a runny nose, sore throat or slight cough and otherwise feel well
 <b>If they have had a positive test for COVID-19, they should:</b>	 <b>Try to stay at home,</b> avoid contact with others for 3 days and follow the guidance on <a href="https://www.gov.uk">gov.uk</a>	 <b>Try to avoid going to school, college or childcare</b> during this time, where they can	 <b>Go back after 3 days,</b> but only if they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to do so

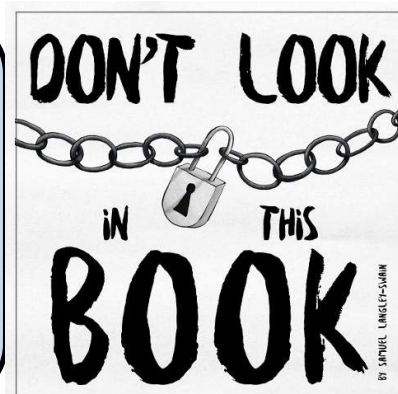
### Book Recommendations
